

Osgoode-Toronto Junior Faculty Forum

Call for Submissions

Dear Colleagues,

Osgoode Hall Law School and the University of Toronto Faculty of Law will be holding a Junior Faculty Forum at the University of Toronto Faculty of Law on **June 21-22, 2012** and invite junior faculty at Canadian law faculties to submit papers for presentation and discussion at the Forum. The Osgoode-Toronto Junior Faculty Forum provides new scholars with an opportunity to present their research and receive constructive feedback from more senior scholars, not only from the sponsor schools but from other Canadian law schools as well. The purpose of the Forum is to provide advice both on the substantive aspects of the work as well as on potential approaches to scholarship.

Six papers will be chosen for presentation at the Forum. Submissions are invited on any topic or issue from faculty members with one to six years of teaching experience and who are not tenured. Previously published work or work already accepted for publication is not eligible for the Forum.

One or two senior scholars from Osgoode, Toronto or another Canadian law school will comment on each paper presented. The format will involve a brief presentation by the author and comments by the senior scholars followed by a general discussion with all of the participants. As there are only six papers, the expectation will be that all presenters and commentators will have read all of the papers prior to the Forum. The Forum will cover presenters' travel expenses, including economy airfare to and from the Forum and accommodation at the Park Hyatt on June 21 (arrangements will be made by the host school).
