Dalhousie University invites applications, expressions of interest in and nominations for the position of Dean of the Schulich School of Law, with the appointment to be effective July 2010.

Established in 1818, Dalhousie University is one of Canada's leading universities. With an enrolment of 16,000 students in 12 faculties and 3,500 faculty and staff, Dalhousie is the largest university and the research powerhouse of Atlantic Canada. Located in the historic city of Halifax, the economic centre of a growing, thriving region, it offers an exceptional quality of life.

The Law School was established in 1883, making it the oldest university-affiliated common law school in the British Commonwealth.
